

## INSTRUCTIONS

The U.S. Department of Education requires students to provide parent information if the student answered “No” to all Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) dependency questions. Dependency status may be reviewed if a student can document extenuating circumstances. Examples of extenuating circumstances include parent abandonment, an abusive family environment that threatens the student’s health or safety, or inability to locate their parents.

Dependency status appeals are reviewed on a case-by-case basis based on individual circumstances. Appeal approval does not guarantee additional federal aid eligibility. The student is responsible for all outstanding bills with Zane State College. If your dependency status appeal is approved, your dependency status must be reevaluated each year until you are meeting the federal independent student criteria.

Allow 2 to 3 weeks for processing time once all necessary documents have been received. You will receive notification of the results by email to your Zane State College email account. Failure to provide the required documentation will delay processing of the application.

### Appeal Requirements

- Complete and submit the 2026-2027 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at <http://studentaid.gov>.
  - Submit your FAFSA with consent to transfer federal tax information (FTI Approval).
  - Attach a typed, clear, signed and dated explanation of your exceptional circumstance. Your statement must include a complete history of:
    1. Your relationship with both your biological and/or legally adoptive parents
    2. Specific dates of events that caused your separation from your parents
    3. Where you have lived since separating from your parents
  - One signed and dated letter on letterhead from a third-party professional\* documenting first-hand knowledge of your exceptional circumstance. Police reports, court documentation, or other legal documents may, in some cases, substitute for the required letter.
    1. Professionals may include: clergy, counselors, social workers, police and physicians.
    2. Letters should be detailed and reflect the writer’s direct knowledge of your exceptional circumstance.
    3. Contact information for each individual must be a part of the letter.
- Note: If a third party letter or other documentation cannot be provided, state the reason it cannot be provided in your appeal letter. In this case, you may submit an additional signed letter from another source (family member or friend of family for example) in its place.
- Submit the following documents if requested for the FAFSA verification process:
    1. 2026-2027 Verification Worksheet
    2. 2027 Tax Information:
      - Tax Filers: Submit a 2024 tax return transcript by visiting [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov) OR use IRS Data Retrieval on the FAFSA (preferred). Signed 1040 form may be accepted if only method available.
      - Non-Tax Filers: Submit a 2024 IRS W2s or wage and income transcript (if received), and an IRS Verification of Non-Filing Letter by visiting [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov) or submit a completed ZSC Written Statement of Non-filing Form.

1. 2024 Tax Return Transcript or signed 1040 form including applicable schedules filed
Non Tax Filers:
1. 2024 Verification of Non-Filing letter or written statement.
2. 2024 W-2s or wage and income transcript (if 2023 income earned)
