

The National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS) indicates that you have received one of more **OVERPAYMENTS** of federal student aid funds. You are required by federal law to return any funds for which you were not entitled. A student who is in overpayment of federal student aid cannot receive further federal financial aid until he or she resolves the overpayment.

Below is a list of acceptable documentation, which you may submit to document that your overpayment has been resolved.

SUBMIT COPIES OF BOTH FRONT AND BACK OF ALL DOCUMENTS.

- A. Paid in Full Letter:** A student can resolve an overpayment by repaying the debt(s) in full and thereby regain eligibility for federal financial aid. The student must provide documentation by submitting an “Overpayment Paid in Full Letter” from the U.S. Department of Education or the holder of the debt.

- B. Satisfactory Repayment Arrangement Letter:** A student in overpayment on federal student aid can be eligible for federal financial aid if he/she has made repayment arrangements that are satisfactory to the U.S. Department of Education or the overpayment debt holder. The student must provide documentation by submitting a written statement from the U.S. Department of Education or the overpayment debt holder indicating that the student has made satisfactory repayment arrangements as documentation of the arrangement.
