Early Admission for Career Help

Get a jump start on your college education while still in high school!

Do you want to: get a head start in your college career?

Explore new fields and careers?

Experience college level courses?

Meet specific college entrance requirements?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, then the Research Early Admission for Career Help program (REACH) may be just what you need.

REACH enables students who are juniors and seniors in high school to take a course at Zane State College – **at no tuition cost**. However, students are responsible for the cost of any books or materials associated with the class. Enrollment is available for summer and fall terms. Please check for availability for spring semester.

Upon completion of course work, your grade will be recorded on an official Zane State College transcript and also can be used as transfer credit to another college. As a candidate for the REACH program, you should reflect a high level of personal and social maturity and should have a firm commitment toward completing the course work.

You are permitted to enroll in any course offered by the college as long as there is no prerequisite and you can attend on a regular basis. Students who enter the program but are unable to complete the required work will be given a failing grade unless proper withdrawal procedures are completed.
